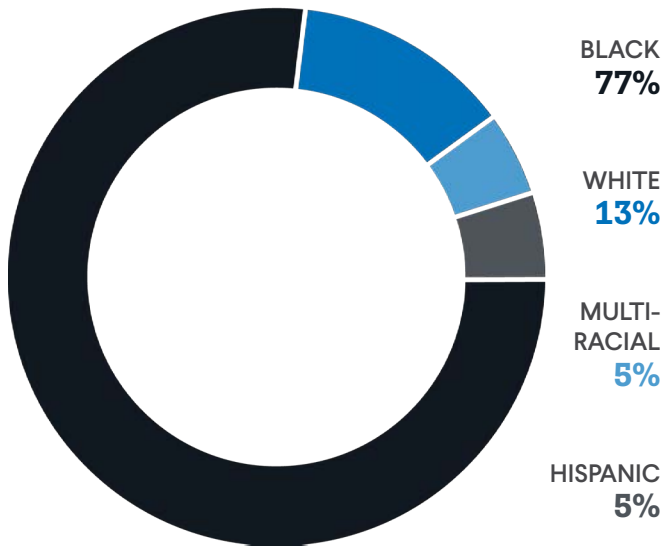

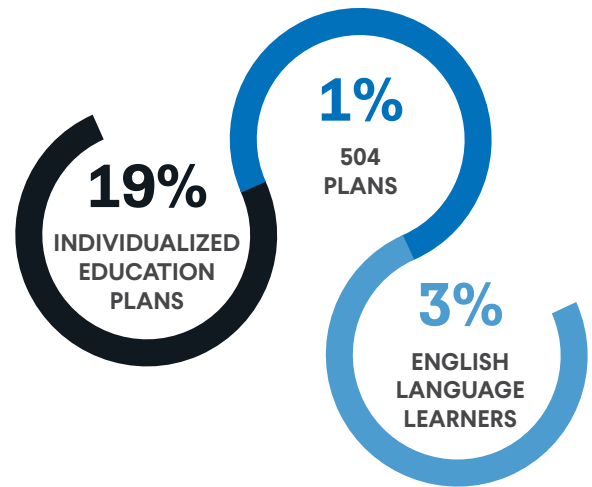

STUDENT DEMOGRAPHICS



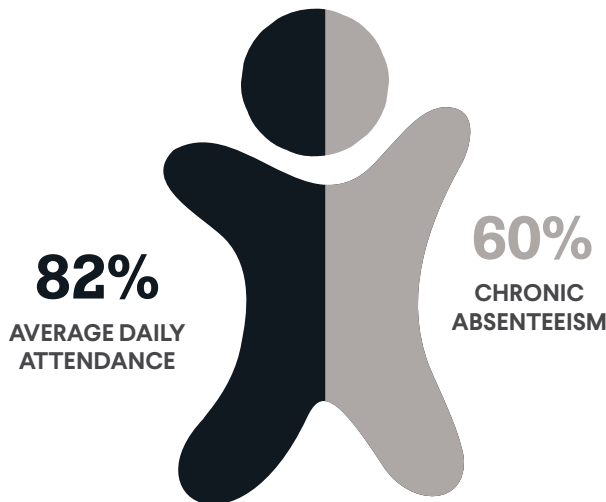

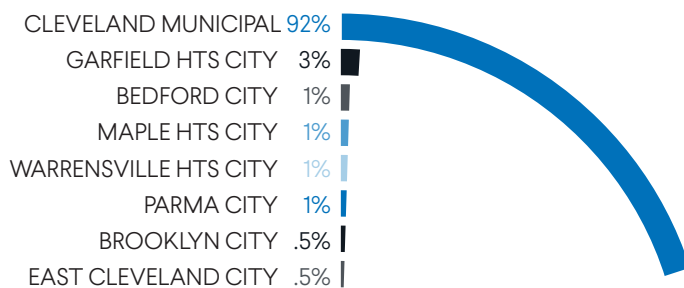

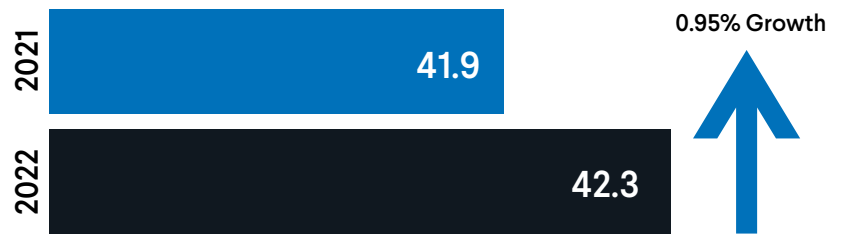
ACADEMIC PROGRESS

The academic goals of Hope Northcoast Academy during the 2021-22 school year were to:

- 100% of scholars in grades K-8 beginning the school year on or above grade level (within standard deviation) in reading will increase their RIT score by an equivalent of 1 year, as defined by i-Ready
- 100% of scholars in grades K-8 beginning the school year below grade level (within standard deviation) in reading will increase their RIT score by an equivalent of 1.5 years, as defined by i-Ready

Emerging from the pandemic, and serving a higher new student population than usual, Hope Northcoast Academy fell short of these goals, but students made significant academic progress as evidenced by year-over-year analysis of state Progress data, particularly in Mathematics.
