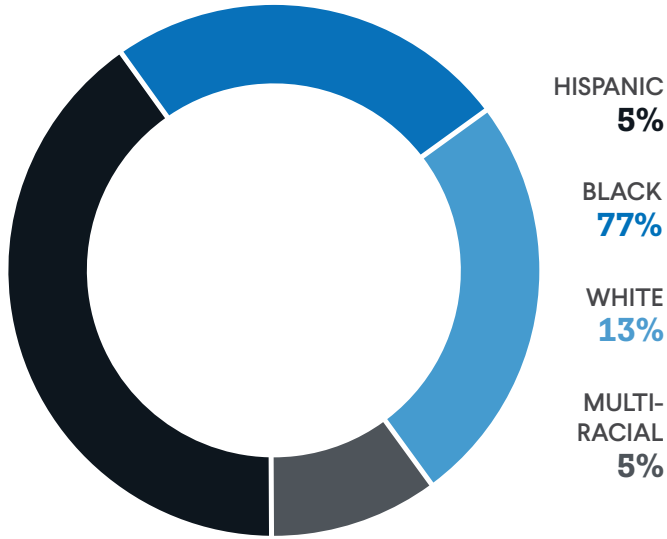

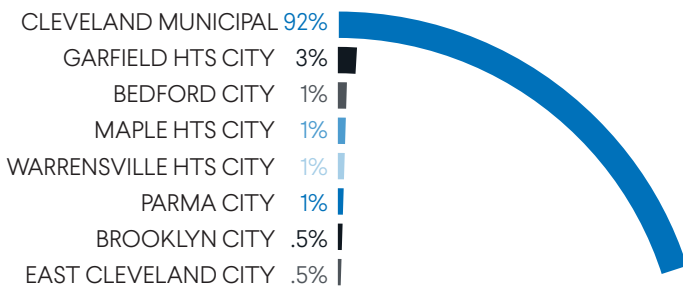

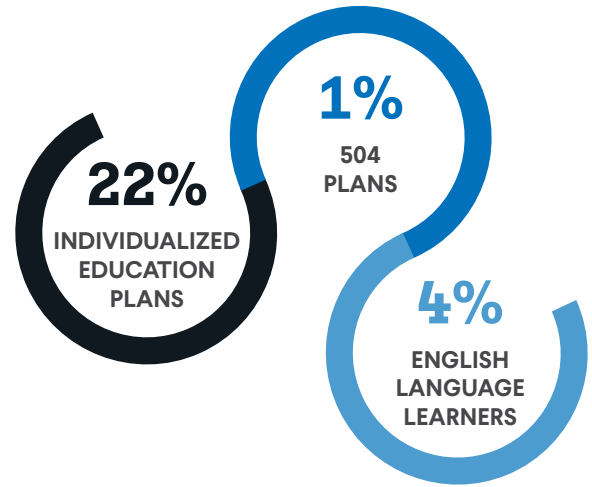

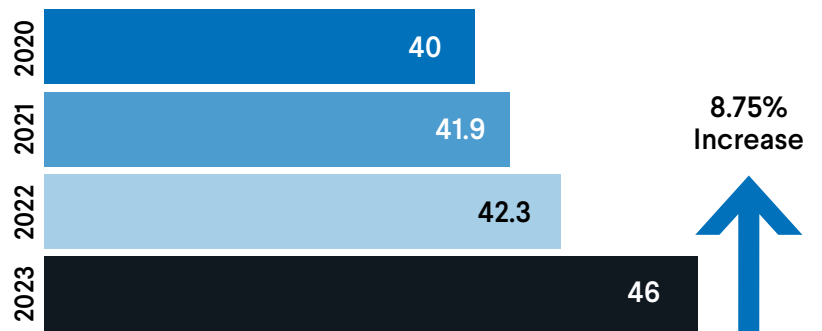


ACADEMIC PROGRESS

The academic goals of Hope Academy by the end of the 2022-23 school year were for students to show 100% growth in English Language Arts and 80% growth in Math according to the i-Ready Assessment.

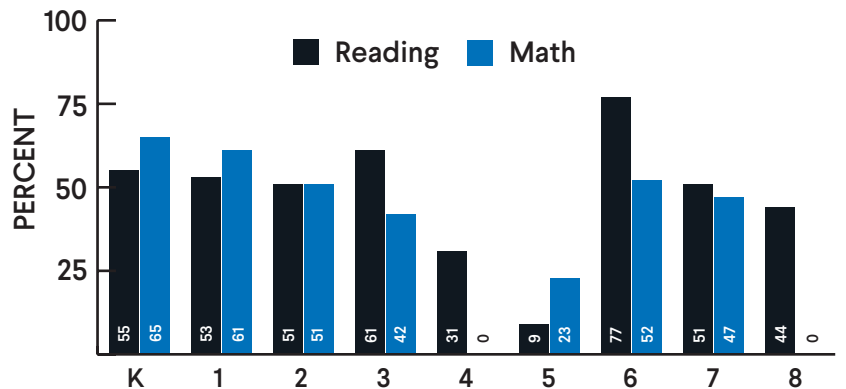
The school achieved both goals with 102% growth in ELA and 81% in Math. Additionally, Hope Academy increased its Performance Index score by over 5%.

St. Aloysius, as the sponsor of this school, is legally mandated to provide oversight, monitoring, and technical assistance.
